- 4. There is a tremendous truth contained in the realization that when God became man He became a workingman, a laborer. There is little we can say about the jobs we do or have done that could not be said of the routine work Jesus Himself did for 20 years or so. Does this change your perspective of the daily work you do? Discuss.
- 5. When we go to work tomorrow, or do our daily duties, picture Him standing beside us, doing the work right there with us. Does this change my attitude in doing the work? Does it make me want to be more like Him? What does being His co-worker look like?
