Discussion Questions

- 4. Have you found yourself approaching God with the mentality of, "Okay, God...I'll say 'Thy will be done', but then You have to do..."? Discuss.
- 5. The children in the Japanese concentration camp were able to live in joy because they were rooted in a trust without condition. Not the trust that they would live, but the trust that "God is here". Please share your thoughts on this and discuss.
- 6. John Piper stated that "God is most glorified in us when we are most satisfied in Him". What is the biggest obstacle to being "most satisfied in God" in your life this week? Discuss.
