 2. Were you uncomfortable or nervous about completing the Consecration? Why? Did you feel like you wanted to be more prepared in some way? Please explain.
 3. We are called “to love with the heart God gave you”. Is this difficult to accept? If so, Why?
 4. Jesus allows His Heart to be wounded. (Imagine, the impassible God allows Himself to hurt!) How does this change your perspective on your own wounds? Please share.
 5. God does not heal all wounds in this life. But we are not called to follow Christ in order to have our wounds removed, but to love Him as much as He possibly can be loved. Is this disappointing? Does it give you a sense of relief? Please explain?
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God in Real Life

1. This week, consecrate your wounded heart to the Wounded Heart of Jesus.
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To the Heart

“I have opened My Heart as a living fountain of mercy. Let all souls draw life from it. Let them approach this sea of mercy with great trust (*Diary*, 1520). On the cross, the fountain of My mercy was opened wide by the lance for all souls — no one have I excluded! (1182). I am offering people a vessel with which they are to keep coming for graces to the fountain of mercy. That vessel is this image with the signature: “Jesus, I trust in You” (327). The graces of My mercy are drawn by means of one vessel only, and that is — trust. The more a soul trusts, the more it will receive (1578)”. ~Jesus to St. Faustina
