Discussion Questions

- 2. Do you ever find yourself falling into the trap of "commemorating" past events or "anticipating" future events more often than you participate in the activity of the moment? Are you able to give an example? Why do you think you fall into this?
- 3. Father Mike mentioned the "long stretches of silence" that those who follow God often find themselves in. These are the moment we are called to trust in the promise, but live in the moment. Would you be willing to share your experience of one of those "long stretches"?
- 4. Saint Paul told the Christians in Thessalonica that they "already knew" what God wanted of them. They may not have known the exact next step, but they knew how followers of Christ ought to live. Do you ever find yourself missing the "known" call of Jesus out of concern for what is not known? Why is that? What do you do in those moments?
- 5. Mary was invited to be a part of God's promise. We will walk through this Advent with Mary. Who is Mary to you?
