Discussion Questions

- 3. Are there any things that you keep asking God for more of? Keeping in mind that you may have very good reasons for asking God for this, have there ever been things you've asked God for in spite of the fact that you realize you aren't using what He has already been given? Discuss.
- 4. If you have done the exercise of writing down some of the strengths or gifts you have, would you mind sharing one or two of those with the people in your group? How might you exercise that gift this week? Does anyone in the group see additional gifts in you that you might not see? Discuss.
- 5. Praying for "divine appointments" is an exercise in faith. What do you think about doing this on a daily basis? Does this idea excite you...does it make you nervous? Please share on that.
