What are some specific examples of ways our current world sees human life and some specific examples of how Christ's view goes against them? Please describe.
- 3. Have you ever noticed a tendency in yourself to shrink into anonymity and autonomy? Discuss.
- 4. Saint Paul instructs us to look not only to our own interests, but also to those of others. When you have done this in your own life, has it done damage to your life or has it been a blessing in your life? Please share your ideas.
- 5. Often, many Christians are unwilling to resolve conflict as Christ instructs us (or are unwilling to share our faith with others) not because we hate but because we simply don't care. What is one relationship in your life that would be different right now if you saw them the way Jesus sees them? (I hope you are willing to share.)
