In what way have you chosen to live in such a way that, when you die, you will know that you are doing the will of the Father? Please share your ideas.
- 5. C.S.Lewis speaks of a life spent "neither doing what I ought nor what I liked". In what ways have you seen this take shape in your own life? Not only have you not done the good, but you didn't even do what you wanted? Are you willing to discuss?
