Discipleship 101

Free to Obey

A person can be touched and made new by Jesus and still not be a disciple. One common aspect of discipleship is actually doing what the rabbi tells one to do. But what happens when the disciple knows better than the rabbi? The answer is: they cease to be a disciple. But what is needed when the disciple thinks they know better than the rabbi? The answer is...they need obedience.

Discussion Questions

- 1. Last week we talked about the fact that having a duty as a disciple is a privilege, and doing that duty is a freedom. We were encouraged to spend at least 20 minutes in our prayer every day, because whether I pray or not is equivalent to whether I am a disciple or not. How has my prayer life been this past week?
- 2. What was a rule that you had growing up that you hated following? Is there a rule that your parents enforced as a kid that you didn't like, but can appreciate their reasoning now?
- 3. Do I "check in" with God in prayer to see what His plans are with certain relationships, tasks, or areas in my life? Do I trust Him enough to let Him respond? Or is it a "it's better to beg forgiveness than ask for permission" kind of relationship?
- 4. Is there something in my life that God has asked or is asking me to do that I am really struggling with finding freedom and joy in trusting and obeying Him with it? Please share.
 - A. Spend some time in prayer, peacefully and joyfully and humbly bringing those things to Jesus. What is His response?
