Discussion Questions

1. Have you ever had a “rival” or an “archenemy” in life? How did this person become your enemy? Discuss.
 2. All of us are tempted to give excuses instead of reasons. What are some excuses you regularly give that might be re-phrased as reasons?
 3. The Rich Young Man may have actually had a “good reason” not to do what Jesus asked. But if you could talk to him right before he walked away, what might you want him to know before he made his final decision? What would you tell him? Reflect on this and share your answers.
 4. The story of the Rich Young Man can scare us because we may think Christ’s call for him is Universal and Arbitrary. But it was Personal and Necessary. Have you ever been afraid of what God might ask you to leave behind for His sake? Where does that come from? Please share and discuss.
 5. It is possible that God has not yet identified a “dramatic choice” that you may have to make for Him. But what are ways that you can train your heart to eliminate God’s rivals today?
