Discussion Questions

- 1. Do you see yourself as being a competitive person? Why or why not?
- 2. Have you been in a season of life like Ezra or Nehemiah when you've believed that God couldn't use you? In the sense of, "I've failed at (this relationship, this friendship, this career move, this sin), and now God couldn't possibly use me"? Please share the experience.
- 3. Taking that one step further, have you ever been convinced that God is disappointed or disgusted with your weakness or your past? What is one thing that you remember in order to break that cycle of "stinking thinking"?
- 4. The Israelites could live as a people of God because God had prepared Ezra and Nehemiah in two different ways for a single great work. Do you believe that God can take what's happened in your past and transform it into something powerful enough to change the Kingdom? Is that difficult to believe? Please discuss.
- 5. Sometimes it can be easy to fall into that trap of the spirit of comparison, comparing ourselves to others' spiritual lives and disqualifying ourselves because of it. Why do we disqualify ourselves based off of our differences?
