### **Discussion Questions**

- 1. Who is one person you would like to be like? In what way would you like to be like them?
- 2. Saint Paul writes, "Christ Jesus came into this world to save sinners." Knowing that sin is universal, do you ever stop and think of yourself individually as someone in *need* of saving? Or is that just a passive thought? Please discuss.
- 3. Taking that one step further, do you see yourself as someone who needs a *Savior* (Jesus)? Is Jesus a part of your life because you need Him and appreciate Him, or is He just nice to have around if/when you feel like connecting with Him?
- 4. Salvation is not just about past forgiveness or a future hope of Heaven, it is being saved from being unChristlike. Have you ever thought of salvation as also being a part of your present, day-to-day life? Can you see it in your own life? In what ways?
- 5. To be saved from being unChristlike is to be saved from Fatherlessness. Is it difficult to let Him love you as a good Dad would love you? How so?
