- 4. It was not the amount that Jesus suffered that saves us. It's the depth with which He loves us that saves us. When you look at the Crucifix, do you find yourself spending more time focusing on the way that He died or the love that He offered? Please discuss.
- 5. The payment of the debt is not the end of the story. The payment of the debt is just the beginning of the story. What is the next step for you? When it comes to the truth of living "debt-free", what do you find yourself focusing on/dreaming about?
