# **Discussion Questions**

- 3. Jesus finished the work of Salvation. And yet, what is unfinished? Jesus left room in it so that *you* could participate. What does that tell you about Him?
- 4. For the Christian, there is only wasted suffering or redemptive suffering. Did you realize that your suffering can be redemptive? How does that change your perspective of it?
- 5. Do you have any examples of when you have offered up your own sufferings for others? Did it bring you closer to Jesus? How so?
